

Art Blocks 500 Survey at Art Blocks Gallery

Between 2020 and 2025, five hundred generative art projects were created and permanently preserved on the Ethereum blockchain, forming the foundational era of Art Blocks. This exhibition presents the complete Art Blocks 500 collection, celebrating the artists and artworks across the Curated, Playground, Factory, Presents, Collaborations, and Explorations categories. Each project exists as algorithmic code stored on-chain, generating unique outputs when activated. The rotating artwork throughout the exhibition reflects the generative nature of the medium, with outputs randomly selected for display. Like the algorithms that generate the artwork, the gallery serves as a space of constant iteration and discovery.

Collecting Art Onchain (the book) - Collector's Limited Edition by Kate Vass at Art Blocks Gallery

THE BOOK is the first analog-to-onchain publishing project dedicated to documenting and preserving the cultural history of Web3. Its debut Collector's Edition, Collecting Art Onchain (2025), pairs 101 utility tokens with 101 analog books, each featuring artwork #0 Tecrrain by Manoloide as the cover. The full Tecrrain long-form collection is 101 iterations by Manoloide in addition to the book's token. Over time, THE BOOK will grow into a decentralized, living archive — a trusted cultural record of digital art, its collectors, artists, and their stories - developed independently of centralized platforms.

Milestones: A History of Generative Breakthroughs on Art Blocks at Art Blocks Gallery — Curated by Kate Vass

This exhibition brings together 17 landmark projects that trace five years of experimentation and evolution on the platform. From the launch-day works of Snowfro's Chromie Squiggle, DCA's Genesis, and Jeff Davis's Construction Token that defined a new cultural frontier to later explorations of text, sound, sculpture, and play, the exhibition charts how generative systems have expanded in scope and ambition. What emerges is less a linear progression than a constellation of breakthroughs: moments where code became character, environment, timekeeper, or game.

The works on view are drawn from leading private collections — including those of Seedphrase, Punk6529, Cozomo de' Medici, Erick Calderon (Snowfro), 137, Coldie, VonMises, Kanbas, Delronde, Seth Goldstein, Colborn, NiftyNaut, Karatekid, G4SP4RD, zaphodok, Justin Trimble, Eli Scheinman, Curated.xyz, and others — whose vision and support have helped define the cultural significance of Art Blocks since its inception.

Together these projects testify to the collaborative energy of a community that has continually redefined the parameters of generative art, transforming it from a niche practice into a living ecosystem with lasting cultural resonance.

A Bridge Between Traditions, Classical Revival is an interactive generative tapestry where participants create flourishing abstract vegetation through touch. The work invites viewers to become co-creators of a living algorithmic canvas, exploring the convergence of nature, technology, and collective expression.

Crosswinds: Valparaíso-Mexico City by Layla Pizarro

While living in Mexico City, Layla Pizarro began translating weather into thread, combining the winds of Valparaíso, where she was born, with the winds of the city she inhabited. This series comprises three textiles, as of now, each condensing eleven days of hourly data into stitched paths that sometimes braid and sometimes erase, like cultures meeting in a body. Installed in Marfa, the works are animated by the actual local wind, letting present gusts move through an archive of past winds. The series is ongoing and will continue until all weeks, from Dec 4th 2024 to Aug 1st 2024, are completed.

FAKE IT TILL YOU MAKE IT (the book) by Maya Man

Artist book signing for FAKE IT TILL YOU MAKE IT, a publication dedicated to the Art Blocks Curated collection of the same name that scrutinizes the promotion of wellness, self-care, and confidence on social media. This monograph acts as an ode to the collection: presenting all 700 editions in glossy detail alongside essays, #block-talk logs, poetry generated with the outputs, source code, feature analyses, and a selection of striking large-format spreads.

Five participants will be randomly selected to receive a signed, numbered print of the final edition work. Covehithe by Harvey Rayner

"Covehithe is an expression of my deep connection to a remote stretch of coastline near my hometown in England. Rather than setting out to create literal landscape scenes I wanted to find a new authentically algorithmic interpretation of the landscape. These works also aim to capture the sense of nostalgia, mystery and ambiance I associate with this place." - Harvey Rayner

Consumer Struggles by Unnikrishna M. Damodaran

Consumer Struggles is a site-specific installation that transforms everyday consumer materials—receipts, packaging, signage, and digital fragments-into abstractions. Alongside these physical elements, I will be displaying my generative works on LCD screens, layering digital hand-drawn lines and abstracted alphabets with the textures of consumer culture. In a world where images rush past us, I want you to pause, to really see. It's my way of exploring form and meaning while questioning how customer communications shape what we share, how we look, and how we consume.

By slowing down the language of advertising and consumer communication, the work resists clarity and optimization, creating a space for ambiguity, hesitation, and reflection in contrast to the speed of capitalist systems.

Both works explore how depth amplifies storytelling and creates a more interactive connection with the viewer.

Galaxy Chocolate by Ryan alien / @gh0stpipe

Galaxy Chocolate plans to feature hand-painted, premium adaptogenic mushroom chocolates and merchandise. They will also present an adaptogenic mushroom sculpture, explaining its growth process.

RASTER (the book) by itsgalo

RASTER (the book) documents RASTER (the artwork) by Galo Canizares. The book collects all of the generated iterations and organizes them thematically in a rich variety of full color plates. Together with critical reflections, descriptions, and source code, RASTER (the book) provides a comprehensive documentation of this unique project.

The Oversoul by Apocalypse

Four years in the making, The Oversoul is a large-scale animated mosaic comprising 144 interconnected portraits, each a looping GIF based on a painting (acrylic on panel). Both the physical mosaic of paintings (10' x 15') and the digital mosaic of animations are on display. Each artwork is available as an ERC-721 and includes its optional physical counterpart. The project's name draws from Ralph Waldo Emerson's essay "The Over-Soul," in which he explores the human spirit as that which connects us a community of distinct individuals.

Responsive Dreams by Amy Goodchild, Paolo Curtoni, and Manuel Lariño

Responsive Dreams is a generative art exhibition, dedicated entirely to showcasing art created by code that takes place yearly in Barcelona. Amy Goodchild, Paolo Curtoni, and Manuel Lariño will be presenting artworks they created for the 2025 edition of Responsive Dreams.

LARFA: CODE GENERATES ART <> ART GENERATES CODE at Art Blocks Gallery

Curated by Larva Labs-The exhibition centers on Quine (2025), Larva Labs' contribution to the Art Blocks Curated series. Drawing from the computer science concept of a "quine" - a computer program that produces a copy of its own source code - the work incorporates its own code into the visuals it creates. Rather than hiding the generative process, Quine makes code both medium and subject, creating a loop where the artwork contains the instructions for its own existence. Analogous to how biological life reproduces itself - each Quine functions as executable code and typographic composition. Rather than creating the artwork directly, the main generator constructs a much smaller program that produces the visual output, including its own source code and the mechanism to reproduce itself. The exhibition traces Larva Labs practice through key works: CryptoPunks (2017), Autoglyphs (2019), and Meebits (2021). Each project represents a different approach to working within technological boundaries. As the final project in Art Blocks' Curated series, Quine honors this foundation by making the code into the artwork itself, a tribute to the history of the platform and the artists.
